10:50	Presentation 2: Community Café Thom Stewart, Maria McGoldrick & Danni Burke will describe a model of care which they have codesigned by working together as a group of people with a commitment to developing community-focused approaches to support people in their emotional health and personal recovery. The forthcoming service will provide out-of-hours social and community supports in Galway City, using a conventional cafe environment and a fully peer-led approach. The project will be staffed by Peer Connectors with personal experience of their own healing process. The model of support was developed through a sustained co-production process, drawing on the expertise and experience of a range of stakeholders. The project was initiated by the Galway Local Forum and nurtured by CHW and wider local community members. They hope it will resonate with others who seek to create peer-led places of safety and community connectedness.
